A proposed exchange of publications with the Liverpool Geological Society was accepted.

The following Annual Report of Council was read:—

During the Session 1912-13 four meetings have been held (by kind permission) in the Apartments of the Geological Society, Burlington House, W., at which seventeen papers were read. At the June meeting Mr. W. L. Bragg exhibited and described lantern-slides illustrating crystal-structure as revealed by Röntgen radiation. Two numbers of the Journal, viz. No. 76 published in December and No. 77 in July, have been issued. These contain sixteen papers and a sixth list of new mineral names compiled by Mr. Spencer, together with notes and reviews. The cost of one of the two plates illustrating the paper on the El Nakhla meteorite by Dr. Prior in No. 76 was defrayed by the author; and the block for the text-figures in the paper 'On the temperature of optical uniaxiality in gypsum' by Messrs. Hutchinson and Tutton was lent by Mr. Hutchinson.

The balance-sheet of the year ending December 31, 1912, shows that the financial position of the Society continues to be satisfactory. The assets (exclusive of the Library and stock of the Journal) amounted to £851 19s. 2d., and the liabilities to £16 7s. 3d. The value of the stock invested in the names of the Trustees of the Society was on that date £738 14s. 0d., corresponding to £13 13s. 7d. for each Life-Member.

During the Session 1912-18 the Society has lost by death one Honorary Member, Dr. K. J. V. Steenstrup. Two Honorary Members (Prof. F. Wallerant and Prof. F. W. Clarke) and eight Ordinary Members have been elected. The total number of members on November 10, 1913, was 143, of whom eighteen are Honorary. Of the Ordinary Members fifty-four have compounded for their annual subscription.

At the International Geological Congress held at Toronto, Prof. H. L. Bowman acted as a delegate to represent the Society.

The Council has to congratulate the Society on its continued prosperity.

On the motion of Mr. Campbell Smith, seconded by Dr. Drugman, the Report was adopted.

A vote of thanks to the Council of the Geological Society for permission to meet in the Apartments of the Society was carried.

The dates of meeting for 1914, proposed by the Council, were approved.

Specimens of minerals from Meldon, Devonshire, were exhibited by Mr. A. Russell and by Mr. F. P. Mennell; and a specimen of orbicular granite from Co. Donegal was shown by Mr. F. N. A. Fleischmann.
