# PROCEEDINGS OF THE MINERALOGICAL SOCIETY

### EXCERPT MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING.

Held in the Apartments of the Geological Society, Burlington House, London, W., January 25, 1934, at 4.15 p.m.

Sir THOMAS H. HOLLAND, F.R.S., President, in the Chair.

The death on January 7 of Dr. H. S. Washington was announced, and the Foreign Secretary was asked to send a letter of condolence to the Geophysical Laboratory, Carnegie Institution of Washington.

The Treasurer reported on the financial position of the Society and presented the audited accounts and Balance Sheet for the year 1933, which were adopted (vol. 23, pp. lxii-lxv). He reported that as Dr. W. R. Jones had not been able to attend the audit, he had, with the President's consent, asked Dr. L. Hawkes to act in place of Dr. Jones. This was approved.

The names of three members one year in arrear with their subscriptions, and two members two years in arrear, were reported.

It was decided to change the dates of the meetings for June and November from June 14 and November 8 to June 7 and November 1 respectively. It was further decided to arrange the dates of meetings for 1935 at the November Council Meeting instead of in June as previously done.

Letters were received from the two recently elected Honorary Members, Prof. V. M. Goldschmidt and Prof. P. Niggli.

The death of Mr. Robert Bell on April 12 was announced. Prof. William Noel Benson was provisionally elected an Ordinary Member of the Society.

The list of Officers and Members of Council was considered, and it was decided that the following four Ordinary Members of Council should retire: Prof. C. E. Tilley, Mr. F. A. Bannister, Dr. W. R. Jones, and Dr. F. C. Phillips; and in their place the following were proposed for submission to the Society: previous Members of Council— Prof. A. Brammall and Dr. H. H. Thomas; new Members—Mr. C. W. Mathews and Dr. T. C. Phemister.

The list of Honorary Members was considered. It was decided to fill one vacancy, and as a result of the ballot Prof. A. E. Fersman was elected subject to confirmation by the General Meeting.

A letter was received from the Edinburgh Geological Society asking for a representative of the Society to attend the centenary celebrations in Edinburgh on September 3 and 4. The General Secretary was appointed as the Mineralogical Society's representative.

EXCERPT MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING.

Held in the Apartments of the Geological Society, Burlington House, London, W., November 1, 1934, at 4 p.m.

Sir THOMAS H. HOLLAND, F.R.S., President, in the Chair.

The resignation of Dr. B. H. Knight was received and accepted. Dr. L. Hawkes and Dr. W. R. Jones were nominated as auditors.

The draft Annual Report was read and after amendment approved.

A proposal to print brief abstracts of papers to be read at the meetings was discussed and it was decided to circulate such abstracts with the notices calling each meeting. Various other means of making the meetings of more general interest to members were considered and it was decided to arrange exhibits of specimens in addition to those shown in illustration of papers.

#### GENERAL (ANNIVERSARY) MEETING.

Held in the Apartments of the Geological Society, Burlington House, London, W., November 1, 1934, at 5.30 p.m.

Sir THOMAS H. HOLLAND, F.R.S., President, in the Chair.

Thirty-two Members and three Visitors were present.

The chairman nominated Mr. A. R. Alderman and Dr. J. D. H. Wiseman to act as scrutineers of the voting-papers for the election of Officers and Council.

The election of Prof. Aleksandr Evgenievich Fersman of Moscow as an Ordinary Member was confirmed.

The General Secretary then read the following :---

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF COUNCIL FOR 1934.

During the session 1933-34 four ordinary meetings have been held. Twentythree papers have been read and four were taken as read. Four numbers (143-146) of the Mineralogical Magazine have been issued containing twenty-one papers, occupying 220 pages and illustrated with 71 text-figures and 4 plates. These numbers also include 638 abstracts occupying 192 pages.

The Council regrets to announce the death of a Honorary Member, Dr. Herry Stephens Washington; a Past-President, Mr. William Barlow; and two Ordinary Members, Mr. Robert Bell and Mr. William Greswolde Williams Sandison.

Eight Ordinary Members have been elected, and Prof. Victor Moritz Goldschmidt and Prof. Paul Niggli have been elected Honorary Members, bringing the total membership on October 31, 1934, to 233 (including eight Honorary Members).

The accounts for the year ending Saturday, December 30, 1933, showed an excess of assets over liabilities of  $\pounds1,151\ 12s.\ 11d.$ , against  $\pounds1,146\ 10s.\ 10d.$  on December 31, 1932. These assets do not include the Library and unsold stock of publications, nor the securities and cash allocated to the Composition Fees account. The value of securities standing in the names of the Trustees on December 30, 1933 was: General Reserve £874\ 14s.\ 3d., Composition Fees account £987 3s. 9d., against £852 6s. 6d. and £962\ 16s.\ 3d. respectively on December 31, 1932. One Composition Fee had been received during the year, but it had not been invested when the accounts were closed.

The Society's Library has received during the year 144 parts of periodicals and 42 separate copies of papers. 22 volumes have been borrowed during the year.

The Nomenclature Committee, after its meeting on November 9, 1933, had forwarded an agreed report to the Nomenclature Committee of the Mineralogical Society of America, but no action had yet been taken on this report in America.

A memorial plaque to William Hyde Wollaston, to which this Society had contributed, was placed on Wollaston's house at 14 Buckingham Street, London, W. 1, and was unveiled on July the fourth by Sir F. Gowland Hopkins, President of the Royal Society. The unveiling ceremony was attended by the President and General Secretary and by several other members of the Society.

The General Secretary was the official delegate of the Society at the celebration of the centenary of the Edinburgh Geological Society on September 3 and 4.

It was proposed by Mr. M. H. Hey and seconded by Dr. A. F. Hallimond that the report be adopted. This was carried unanimously.

The scrutineers reported that 44 voting papers had been returned to the General Secretary and that the list nominated by the Council had been approved. The President declared these Officers and Ordinary Members of Council elected for the ensuing year :---
